## Organisational Background

SharingStories Foundation works with Indigenous communities to protect, maintain and grow language, stories and cultural heritage. Engaged as a culturally safe partner, SharingStories delivers community driven media and education initiatives that build capacity for cultural continuity, production and distribution of rich outcomes.

## Purpose of Role

The Partnerships and Development Director will be an important member of the executive team as we continue to build a well-resourced, accountable, responsive organisation, established as a respected leader in the field of community arts/cultural development and education.

## Responsibilities include:

- a) Develop, implement and lead the organisation's business and fundraising plan;
- b) Steward new and existing corporate, government and philanthropic relationships that support the organisation's overall vision and strategy;
- c) Engage with SharingStories' partner communities across Australia to co-develop and support community revenue generation initiatives through licensing of project outcomes and educational packages;
- d) Coordinate partnership and fundraising activities and events;
- e) Manage business development budget and executive reporting;
- f) Collaborate with SharingStories executive, administrative and program team on business and partnership development opportunities; and
- g) Collaborate with the Finance and Administration Manager, as needed.

Candidates must address the following selection criteria by demonstrating their experience as they relate to the above role responsibilities:

### **BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT & COMMUNICATION SKILLS**

- a) Demonstrated experience in partnership and business development (5+ years);
- b) Project and budget management skills with ability to design, plan, implement and track a range of initiatives;
- c) Experience in developing and managing financial plans and reporting financials
- d) Demonstrated experience in stewarding relationships and ability to draw upon national networks; and
- e) Strong written and oral communication skills including the ability to communicate effectively with a range of stakeholders, partners and with First Nations community partners.

### SOCIAL AND CULTURAL SKILLS

- a) Must be of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander descent \*;
- b) Committed to supporting First Nations cultural and linguistic continuity; and
- c) Cross-cultural understanding including the ability to work with Indigenous People and understand sensitivities regarding Indigenous cultures/protocols.

## **OTHER SKILLS**

- a) Ability to travel between 4-6 weeks per annum to meetings with partners and team as well as community across Australia. This role will also involve working with SharingStories Jajoo Warngarra (Advisory Council) as required;
- b) Digital system confidence including familiarity with online project management systems; and
- c) Skilled in taking initiative, working independently from a home office and operating within a national team.
